

Attachment A - Scope of Work

A Road Safety Assessment was performed on IR 18 in 2011, wherein the most serious deficiencies were listed and recommendations were made, including the following proposed activities:

ACTIVITIES:

- 1. Pavement repairs and chip seal surface treatment needed from milepost 20 to 40
- 2. New pavement markings needed from milepost 20 to 40
- 3. New signs are needed from milepost 20 to 60, including watch for animal signs, warning signs, speed limit signs, route confirmation and destination signs
- 4. New delineators are needed from milepost 20 to 60
- 5. Some guardrails need new terminals, delineation, and have vegetation growing in front of them
- 6. Drainage issues at the culvert near Joe's Curve

The RSA was the basis of a September 2013 grant application to the Federal Highways Administration under its Tribal Transportation Safety Program for \$980,174. The grant was awarded to the Havasupai Tribe, and the Tribe intends to begin the safety work as soon as possible.

Representatives from the Tribes met on July 11, 2014 to inspect the road and discuss the scope of work for the upcoming project, including Havasupai facilities director Armando Marshal, Hualapai public works director Philip Wisely and Joseph Rocha, and consultants Kevin Turner and Eric Jensen.

The Havasupai Tribe, under this scope of work, intends to fund activities 2 through 5 as funds allow. The Hualapai Tribe, under this scope of work intends to fund activity 1 as funds allow, in the areas agreed upon by the Tribes as most critical for the safety of all Tribal members and visitors.

Activity 6 may be jointly funded; however, funds may not be available to perform construction work or a proper drainage study as required to make improvements to the area. Activity 6 may therefore be postponed until funds can be identified.

Guiding Principles

This memorandum of understanding (herein after referred to as "MOU") dated $\frac{03}{11/15}$ is executed between the Hualapai Indian Tribe and the Havasupai Indian Tribe in order to better achieve mutual goals through an improved relationship between sovereign Tribal governments.

The Parties to this MOU recognize and respect the sovereignty and legal status of one another. The Parties further recognize that each has and reserves all rights, powers and remedies now or hereafter existing at law, in equity, or by statute, Treaty, or otherwise.

This MOU provides a framework that the signatory parties agree to use to achieve the purpose of applicable laws and regulations.

This MOU does not diminish, increase, or otherwise alter the rights and entitlements of each party, and nothing herein is intended to confer jurisdiction to either Tribe over the other.

This MOU is a testament to the commitment by the Tribes to strengthen their government-to-government relationship. This relationship respects the sovereign status of each Tribe, enhances and improves communication between them, and seeks to facilitate the resolution of issues.

This MOU provides a foundation for subsequent agreements between the governments of a more specific nature that outline specific tasks to address or resolve specific issues, such as,

- Road construction and maintenance (see Attachment A- Scope of Work)
- Bridge construction and maintenance
- Law enforcement and emergency response
- Fire protection and emergency medical services
- Archeological protections
- Environmental regulatory programs and funding
