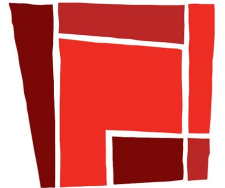

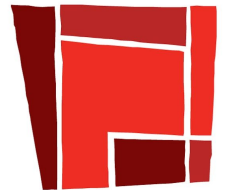

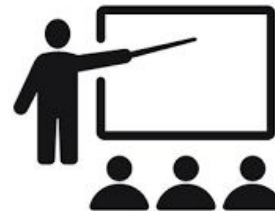
COMMUNITY PREPAREDNESS:
