Dear Mr. Mendez:

We have reviewed your June 13, 2006 request to amend the FY 2006-2008 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) to include the projects in the enclosed tables. These changes to the Maricopa Association of Governments (MAG) TIP were approved by the MAG Regional Council on May 24, 2006.

We accept this Amendment in accordance with 23 CFR 450 and find that this STIP amendment was developed based on a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive transportation planning process in accordance with the 23 USC 134 and Section 5303 of the Federal Transit Act (49 USC 53). 

Dear Director Mendez:

On May 24, 2006, the MAG Regional Council approved an amendment to the FY 2006-2010 MAG Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). As the Governor's designee for approval of TIPs and TIP amendments, we are requesting your approval of this amendment. We are also requesting that ADOT process the necessary amendment to the relevant Statewide Transportation Improvement Program.

Following approval of the TIP by the Regional Council on July 27, 2005, the TIP was approved by you, in a letter to the Federal Highway Administration, on November 28, 2005. Since approval of the TIP, two RARF funded environmental studies on I-10 have been identified that need to be added to the TIP and a TIP amendment is necessary to carry out these additions. These two studies are regarded as exempt for air quality conformity analysis purposes. In addition, four locally funded freeway interchange projects have been identified that have been requested to switch to federally funded. As they are already listed in the current TIP as Locally or State funded, these projects are being forwarded for information as part of an Administrative Adjustment and no approval is required at this time.

Your support and the assistance of your staff in ensuring the timely progression of these projects is much appreciated. We look forward to a continuing close relationship with the State in meeting the transportation needs of our region. Please contact me or Paul Ward at the MAG office if you need any clarification regarding this amendment.
