I'd also like to use this opportunity to repeat a comment that we made to the State Transportation Board during their June meeting in Prescott. We hope that CYMPO will continue to pursue an acceleration of the 69/89 intersection project. While this is currently programmed for FY2009, any effort to move this project up in priority will be appreciated.

We note that all of the projects in the MTIP represent an investment of more than \$154 million over the next five years—a significant amount—but we know that there are still many projects in need of funding as we seek to keep up with the projected growth in our area. The Chamber stands ready to take part in any discussions that affect our transportation future.

**Re: MTIP Fiscal Years 2007 - 2011 for Federal and State Funded Projects -- #4,5,6** - We applaud Prescott Valley's forward thinking in creating this multiuse pathway!

**#10** - It has been disappointing to hear of the delay in starting work on the 89/69 Interchange, and we appreciate efforts being made in attempting to move the timeline of this project up. Perhaps, though, it is possible to start work sooner on the project for which we helped win full grant funding - the pedestrian/bicycle pathway?

**#14,15** - It seems perhaps premature to begin planning for this highway before the transit study is completed. For example, the transit study may recommend dedicated lanes along Hwy 69 for busses. Plus, the whole length of Hwy 69 should really have an HOV lane. We would also pose the question, how are pedestrians and bicyclists being accommodated within the existing plan for these sections? What about a multiuse (nonmotorized) overpass near the mall? I'm sure all are aware that quite a few pedestrians and cyclists currently try to walk/bike alongside Hwy 69. Citizens who can not, or choose not to, drive a car are put at great risk having no accommodations to travel down to the shopping centers.

**#17** - We wonder whether three lanes plus bike lanes and sidewalks might serve ALL users better, especially considering this area's rapid evolution into a dense urban area.

**Re: MTIP Fiscal Years 2007 - 2011 for Locally Funded Projects --**

**#1,2,11,12,17,18,20,24** - We sincerely hope that the original plans for bike lanes

and a sidewalk on one side remain intact along the City's section of Williamson Valley, and that the striped shoulders remain along the County's section.

#6 - We also sincerely hope the original plans for Iron Springs to have bike lanes and sidewalks (on both sides) remain intact.

#3 - For this new road, we ask how bicyclists and pedestrians will be accommodated, invited, to travel here - both along it and across it. All new road construction in this region should, by default, accommodate pedestrians and bicyclists; this follows the recommendations of the recent transportation plan proposed by Lima & Associates.

#8 - Are bike lanes and sidewalks (on both sides) part of the reconstruction of Ruth St.? It would sure benefit the high school students.

#15 - We are hoping bike lanes will be included as part of the reconstruction of Mt. Vernon. This area is turning into a very nice way to travel through town by bike!

#13,14 - As part of the reconstruction of both Rosser and Demerse Streets, we ask how pedestrians and bicyclists will be accommodated, both along and across the streets.

#21 - Park Ave. is an essential route for students attending Lincoln Elementary: wide sidewalks on both sides and bike lanes along the whole length will greatly benefit the neighborhood. Some traffic calming measures would also be welcomed, as cars often travel at speeds much higher than the posted limit.

#16,19 - As part of the widening of these two roads in Chino Valley, we ask how ALL users (pedestrians, cyclists, along with motorists) will be accommodated safely?

Comment/Questions

#14,15 - It seems perhaps premature to begin planning for this highway before the transit study is completed. For example, the transit study may recommend dedicated lanes along Hwy 69 for busses. Plus, the whole length of Hwy 69 should really have an HOV lane. We would also pose the question, how are pedestrians and bicyclists being accommodated within the existing plan for these sections? What about a multiuse (nonmotorized) overpass near the mall? I'm sure all are aware that quite a few pedestrians and cyclists currently try to walk/bike alongside Hwy 69. Citizens who can not, or choose not to, drive a car are put at great risk having no accommodations to travel down to the shopping centers.

#17 - We wonder whether three lanes plus bike lanes and sidewalks might serve ALL users better, especially considering this area's rapid evolution into a dense urban area.

Response

Items 14 and 15 are both Developer driven projects (Item 14: Prescott Valley's Cross Roads Mall and Item 15: A study by the Tribe for future development along their frontage). Currently ADOT does not have a study in these areas. Since these are Developer driven projects ADOT can only require the Developers to mitigate their impacts to the highway. We can not require them to add HOV lanes, sidewalk, or bike lanes.

Item 17: On this project ADOT planned to replace the bridge on SR 169 over the Agua Fria. Currently the bridge is a two lane bridge. Also, ADOT has planned intersection improvements at the SR 69 and 169 intersection. Developments from both Prescott Valley and Dewey-Humboldt have shown interest in partnering with ADOT to add additional improvements to SR 169. The project would improve the highway to two lanes in each direction with a center turn lane.
