
Dear Mr. Halikowski:



Please be advised that as Executive Director of the Yuma Metropolitan Planning Organization I am making the following amendment to the FY 2007-2011 Transportation Improvement Program.

Table 3a / 2009 Federal Economic Recovery Stimulus Package Projects. County 14<sup>th</sup> Street Pavement Preservation, Yuma County, resurface. Amend funding amount:

Transfer \$300,000 from Round-About Project to Pavement Preservation Project.

Construction bids for the San Luis II POE Round-about came in lower than expected, therefore the \$300,000 ARRA STP funds will not be needed for the project. Therefore, Table 3A is amended to reflect \$0 in ARRA SPT Funds for the POE Round-about carrying the \$300,000 to the Pavement Preservation project on County 14<sup>th</sup> Street. Doing so will increase the ARRA STP grant award for the preservation project from \$632,000 to \$932,000.
