Dear Director Halikowski,

Attached please find a list of amendments to the current FMPO TIP related to FY 2010 Safety Funding. These amendments were originally sent as part of the ARRA II amendments on February 24, 2010. I am reissuing them here for two reasons:

1. To make a clear separation from the more speculative ARRA II funding.
2. To make administrative adjustments to the planned safety projects based on more definitive information from ADOT-HSIP, ADOT Local Government, and FHWA.

These amendments were originally approved by the FMPO Executive Board on February 24, 2010.

In summary, the sign inventory is being separated from the sign replacement program with distinct funding for each. The safety program funding is being increased based on the advice from your staff. A traffic signal is deleted because we cannot achieve the clearances and JPA in time to meet the June 1, 2010 deadline. I will be working with my colleagues to see if exchanges are possible for the balance of the FMPO safety funds allocation.
