
Thank you for your letter, dated June 25, 2010, approving the Flagstaff Metropolitan Planning Organization (FMPO) request to amend the FY 2010-2013 Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) to include the STIP Amendment #46.

The amendment was developed by a process in accord with 23 USC 134 and 49 USC 53. Transit Element projects are exempt from air quality conformity determination. Our finding was coordinated with the Federal Highway Administration.

This letter constitutes approval of the amendment into the Arizona Statewide Transportation Improvement Program, with the understanding that the eligibility of individual projects for funding is subject to the applicants' satisfaction of all administrative requirements.
