ADOT invests available funds through a variety of federal and state highway, aviation, transit, rail, bridge and safety programs.

ADOT's five major investment categories include:

Maintaining and Operating What We Have

TYPES OF PROJECTS/WORK

Maintenance: Planned upkeep and unplanned work performed to repair an asset or respond to specific conditions, incidents or events.

Surface treatments: Improvements that extend the life of an existing asset.



Improving What We Have

TYPES OF PROJECTS/WORK

Rehabilitation: Structural improvements that extend the service life of an existing asset, re-establish load-bearing capacity and bring it back to a fully functioning system as originally designed and constructed.

Reconstruction: Completely rebuilding an existing road, bridge or other asset.



Modernizing What We Have

TYPES OF PROJECTS/WORK

Modernization: Improvements that upgrade efficiency, functionality and safety.



Building Something New

TYPES OF PROJECTS/WORK

Expansion: New construction work planned and performed to add capacity to the state transportation system.



Pass-Through Funds

Specific funding for aviation, rail, and transit where ADOT only administers the distribution of these funds while the work is performed by transit and aviation agencies.
