Requirements

A person with a disability being transported by an Organization must have one or more of the following conditions:

- Unable to walk 200 feet without stopping to rest
- Unable to walk without help from another person or a brace, cane, crutch, wheelchair or other prosthetic or assistive device
- Lung disease with forced respiratory, expiratory volume for one second, if measured by spirometry, is less than one liter, or the arterial oxygen tension is less than 60 mm/hg on room air at rest
- Uses portable oxygen
- Cardiac condition with Class 3 or 4 functional limitations as by American Heart Association standards
- Severely limited in ability to walk due to an arthritic, neurological or orthopedic condition

Additional Information

- The disability plate or placard provides the Organization with the privilege of parking in specially marked parking spaces provided for the exclusive use of persons with a disability. The person with a disability must be a passenger in the vehicle when the disability parking space is used.
- Disability plates may be personalized for an additional fee of \$25 per year for standard personalized plates or \$50 per year for specialty personalized plates. A Special Plate Application ([form # 96-0143](#), available online) must be completed for a personalized plate. All choices must be approved. The fee for a remake of a lost, stolen or mutilated personalized disability plate is \$5 plus postage/handling, if mailed.
- Placard replacements: If the current record cannot be located and the original application is unavailable for verification, a new application will be required. There is no fee for replacement placards.
- A postage fee of \$1.96 is required when requesting a disability or deaf/hard of hearing plate. The fee can be submitted by check or money order and mailed to the address listed at the top of the application. Please email specialplates2@azdot.gov for instructions on how to process your application electronically.
- If an organization, a signed statement by an authorized officer of the organization affirming that the registered vehicle that is owned or leased by the organization and that will display the placard or the international symbol of access special plate primarily transports persons with physical disabilities.
- If a nonprofit organization, a signed statement by an authorized officer of the organization affirming that the nonprofit organization provides assistance to senior citizens and will maintain records of each volunteer who uses placards to transport persons with physical disabilities.
- Most other states and the provinces of Canada have agreed to honor Arizona disability plates and placards. When traveling by vehicle in other states, provinces or foreign countries, it is a good idea to contact the appropriate motor vehicle authorities.
- Use of plates or placards in violation of Arizona law may result in fines and penalties charged to the operator, to the person in charge or to the owner of the vehicle, and the plate or placard may be recalled.
