
Who Is Eligible for MVD Record Redaction?

A primary individual with a court order of protection/injunction against harassment.

In addition, any other person named in the court order who resides at the same address as the primary individual is also eligible.

How Does It Work?

This program provides a means to suppress the addresses and telephone numbers on driver license records, as well as the address and certain other information on vehicle records.

The Arizona MVD record redaction program applies only to records maintained by Arizona MVD. Program participants may still have other personal information that may be publicly accessible in other public records, websites and commercially available databases.

Here are the required steps:

1. The primary individual obtains a court order of protection/injunction against harassment.

2. The primary individual applies for record redaction by filling out an affidavit form provided by the Superior Court in the county where he or she resides.
3. The primary individual files the affidavit with the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court along with a copy of the court order of protection/injunction against harassment.
4. The court notifies the primary individual of its ruling on the affidavit.
5. The court also notifies the Arizona Department of Transportation, Motor Vehicle Division that the affidavit has been granted.
6. The Motor Vehicle Division, Order of Protection/Injunction Against Harassment (OOP/IAH) desk suppresses all of the relevant information on the Motor Vehicle Division database.

Things to Remember

1. The applicant must have a valid Arizona driver license or ID card in order to qualify.
2. A record can only be suppressed for a person indicated in the court order.
3. All persons must live at the same address as the primary individual.
4. ARS 28-454 is specific to Arizona MVD records.
5. The suppressed information is not available to the public.
6. The suppressed information remains available to law enforcement, government agencies and some private entities for health and safety issues, (e.g., manufacturer recalls, jury pools and military draft).
7. Vehicle renewals by mail, phone or Internet are still allowed, unless you have changed your address within two months prior to registration.

Things to Remember (con't)

8. Enrolled participants can renew their vehicle registrations online at azmvdnow.gov, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, by phone toll-free at 888-713-3031, by mail, or in person at any MVD or authorized third party office.
9. Enrolled participants can buy or sell vehicles, and the system will automatically add to or delete vehicles from the program. You do not have to call the OOP/IAH desk.
10. Removal from the program is by court order only.
11. If your Social Security Number appears on your license, visit azmvdnow.gov or an authorized MVD office to request a duplicate driver license with the SSN replaced by an MVD system generated number.
12. Please be aware and acknowledge the consequences and ongoing responsibilities that are associated with restricting public access to your information.
