Re: SVMPO TIP 2019-2013 Amendment Two

Mr. Mark Hoffman:

The SVMPO Executive Board approved Amendment Two to the SVMPO 2019-2023 TIP at their regular Executive Board meeting on January 17, 2019. This Amendment included three changes as follows:

- ❖ Moved the \$2,285,356 construction phase funds for the SVMPO 18-01 Fry Blvd between N. Garden Ave. and 7th Street; N. Garden Ave. between Fry Blvd. and Buffalo Soldier Trail project from FY19 to FY20. Design is expected to be completed in the middle of FY20, with the construction phase likely to occur in the second half of FY20. This TIP Amendment was requested by the City of Sierra Vista after review of the proposed design and construction schedule with the SVMPO Administrator.
- ❖ Identified \$70,000 in funding for the Town of Huachuca City to construct, under an ADOT ROW/Encroachment Permit, an Emergency Pre-Emption Signal for the Whetstone Fire Dept. on Highway 90. ADOT has indicated approval of the placement of this emergency pre-emption signal on the State Highway and has waived a warrant study for this signal device. This project will proceed as a HURF Exchange project in partnership with ADOT's Southcentral District.
- ❖ Placed the remaining FY19 funds, \$115,669, into the approved North Garden/Fry Blvd. Design phase in behalf of the City of Sierra Vista. This will involve amendments to the HURF Exchange agreements, and the IGA with the City; however, the Board concurred with the TAC that these additional funds provided a potentially needed contingency for the Design phase.

Be advised that as the 2019-2023 TIP has yet to be approved by FHWA, this amendment may need to go forward as Amendment Four on the 2018-2022 approved TIP. The SVMPO Executive Board; however, sees this as their second Amendment to their July 19, 2018 approved 2019-2023 TIP.

Please forward this TIP Amendment for approval and inclusion in the STIP. Thank you for your assistance.
